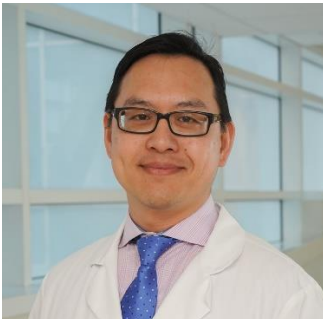
Dr. Theresa Madaline Appointed as Associate Chief Quality Officer for NYP/Columbia
